

REMINDER: ID Needed

We use LobbyGuard at our front door to help identify and track all visitors to the building during the school day. This system requires a government-issued photo ID (such as a driver's license). We also use this system for when someone signs out a student, so don't forget to bring it up to the building when you arrive.



IREAD-3

All 2nd and 3rd graders will be taking the IREAD-3 minimum proficiency reading assessment next week. **Please do all you can to help ensure that your students get good sleep for those days.** We expect to receive initial results from the testing toward the end of March, and we will notify any 3rd graders who Did Not Pass and arrange for some additional support and intervention before they retake at the beginning of summer break. All families will receive a score report after the state releases those.

CogAT Testing

Our district requires additional information on the academic needs and performance of individual children in order to ensure that the school corporation is providing instruction at the appropriate level for each child. Depending on the information needed, your child may be administered a screener for the CogAT High abilities assessment. This screener is a short 30 minute test and will be given during the two weeks following spring break.

These students were called down to the cafeteria on Friday to be recognized. Thanks for being valuable contributors to our Viking community.




Reporting Absences


