We use LobbyGuard at our front door to help identify and track all visitors to the building during the school day. This system requires a government-issued photo ID (such as a driver's license). This month, FES students learned how to assess the true size of a problem and then how to match their reaction to it. Students learned that most problems are levels 1-3 and they can be solved with calm words, compromise, or even just moving on. If a problem is truly a 4 or 5, they may feel dysregulated and will likely need an adult's help to arrive at a solution. This visual is now in every grade level classroom and is available to you HERE for use at home if you would like. Several students commented that they needed this at home to help them not overreact to their brothers and sisters!

MV Reads: News from the Library

Reading books with your child can be a great way to connect while helping them learn valuable lessons. Author of *The Read-Aloud Handbook* Jim Trelease says in this article "Don't Stop Reading to Your Kids Once They Learn How to Read" "If you read a book about a kid who gets in trouble by hanging out with the wrong crowd, your child is going to experience that directly, and she's going to experience it with you at her side, and you can talk about it together. You can ask questions like: 'Do you think the boy made the right choice?' 'Do you think that girl was really her friend?' When you talk about a book together, it's not a lecture, it's more like a coach looking at a film with his players, going over the plays to find out what went right and what went wrong."
